The funeral took place on January 8th and the fondness for Janet was truly reflected in the phenomenal turnout from the residents of Smisby. The service at Bretby Crematorium was led perfectly by Ian Higginbotham who had put together a quite wonderful eulogy of Janet's life. The gathering afterwards was poignantly hosted in the Village Hall itself, enjoying Janet's favourite past time of tea & cakes. Janet was much loved and is sadly missed by everyone.

Turning our thoughts to the rest of the year we are keen to highlight some of the Community Events we are looking forward to hosting during 2014. With Easter now almost upon us, in amongst all the chocolate and Easter Egg consumption there will be an Easter Sunday Service and Holy Communion at Smisby Church on 20th April at 9.00am with all families welcome.

In the summer, as the Nation begins to expect, we will look to embrace the Football World Cup, and get behind the England Team with a World Cup themed party on the evening of Saturday 14th June to watch the England v Italy game. This will take place on the Jubilee Grounds followed by a camp out for the brave and hardy amongst us. The party will begin at 7pm where we will be serving hot dogs on the evening. Everyone is encouraged to bring your own drinks and enjoy a chance to get together whilst cheering the boys on. Whether a footie fan or not, a great occasion to socialise together. Smisby Village Hall

The 2013 Village Hall AGM in December was suspended due to queries raised with regards to the adopted Village Hall Constitution and advertising of the meeting. The committee has been seeking advice from Rural Action Derbyshire and other third parties since December, and the 2013 AGM will be re-convened (and advertised in advance) once clarification on the Village Hall Constitution has been received. Members of the community are welcome to attend the Village Hall AGM.



In the mean time the Village Hall remains available to regular and 'one-off" hirers.

For one-off events, hire charges for Smisby Parish Members are currently as follows: Up to 2.5 hours: £15.00; 1/2 Day: £29.00; Full Day: £44.50

Hire times and charges include the setting up and clearing away period. Different charges apply to hirers from outside the local community. Deposits will be required separately, refundable following a satisfactory post event inspection.

There may be certain occasions when one-off events can take precedence over long-term regular bookings, but normally this will require not less than one month's notice. Booking enquiries can be made with the Bookings Clerk on 07507 789292.

Dog Fouling

The Parish Council is pleased to report that dog fouling seems to have decreased since the presence of Dog Wardens in the Parish. They will continue to have a profile in the area. Bagged dog waste can now be placed into any litter bin but there have still been the occasional problem of dog owners bagging the waste and leaving their bags in trees. This is not only very unsightly, but the bags do not biodegrade, it is littering. Please bin it.

<u>Thefts</u>

There have been reports of more oil thefts and thefts of farm machinery, so please keep an eye out for anyone acting suspiciously in the village.

Potholes

The Parish Council are aware of the large number of potholes within the parish boundary. A number of these have been reported and some of them have now been repaired. It is important to report potholes when you see them, especially as more money is being made available to County Councils to repair potholes. Anyone can report potholes by ringing 08456 058 058 or 01629 533190. You can also report them via Derbyshire County Council's website www.derbyshire.gov.uk. Follow the link to 'Transport and Roads' then click on 'Roads and Traffic' then 'Report a Road Fault'. There is an interactive map allowing you to zoom in and pin point exactly where the pothole is.

<u>Grant</u> The Parish Council are very pleased to have been awarded £400 from the Members' Community Leadership Scheme run by Derbyshire County Council. County Councillor Linda Chilton allocated this grant to Smisby Parish Council to help towards the cost of providing the Christmas tree lights. The Parish Council would therefore like to thank Councillor Chilton for her assistance and on going support.

Removal of SDDC public recycling centre at Smisby Day Nursery Following the successful introduction of the Easy Green Recycling Scheme in October 2013 the Council feel that the usage of the cardboard and plastic bottle recycling has decreased significantly and therefore will be removing both bins by mid April

2014. We have noticed that the cardboard bin is still used by many residents and have asked that it remains. However, the Council feel it is not justified and have suggested that should residents cardboard recycling not fit in their new bins then it is ok to leave it at the side of the bin for collection.

Should residents feel this is not working for them then they should raise through the Parish Council who may be able to put forward reasons to re-instate the service.

<u>Sewerage Issues</u> The water authority, Severn Trent, has had to be called out in emergency on several occasions recently with blockages in mains drains. Could we ask that all residents be careful and considerate with what they discard, as the drains are clearly struggling to cope.



Ashby Art Club meet in the village hall on Monday evenings, when members can get together to paint and socialise. New members are always welcome. The club regularly invite demonstrators and hold workshops. On April 14th Brian Steventon demonstrates pen and ink monochrome techniques. He is the onsite artist at the Black Country Living Museum. This



demonstration is followed by Tony Sumpter holding a life drawing workshop on 12th May.

Members are currently very busy preparing for the club annual art exhibition over Easter This is held at Ticknall village hall. (from April 19th to April 21st). The exhibition opens at 10am and closes at 4.30pm over the week end and at 4pm on Easter Monday. There are paintings on sale, refreshments and a raffle for charity. All are welcome. Art Club members are also busy with preparations for the Ashby Art Festival. This festival opens on 17th May and runs until 31 May. Members are involved in painting some of the 8' x 4' wall boards for the Outdoor Art gallery which are displayed on buildings around the town for one month. The theme this year is "Myths and Legends".

Art Club members are also involved organising and preparing entries for the Festival Art Exhibition and competition, which will be held on the 24th to 26th May at the Royal Hotel, Station Street, Ashby. Parochial Charity

In the last Newsletter we stated that disposable funds are now building up and that we are looking for ideas for a substantial project in Smisby that the Charity could fund. We also asked if any residents would be willing to join a small discussion group to put forward ideas for consideration. Sad to relate, not a single idea was forthcoming nor did anyone volunteer to talk about possible future projects. Maybe in the run-up to Christmas there were more important things to think about, so now we are briefly repeating those same questions and hoping that this time there will be some response! All activities of the Charity are mentioned in the Newsletter from time to time and the charity Report & Accounts are to be found on the Charity Commission web site www.charitycommission.gov.uk/find-charities/, our registered charity number being 515251. The Trustees of the Charity very much want to fund activities or projects that are widely supported by local residents so do please give thought to how our growing disposable funds might be used to benefit the community. A suggestion was made some months ago for a boule area to be created on the playing field so that petangue could be played there, as part of any events that involved the recreation ground. We have ascertained the dimensions for the flat gravelled area that would be needed, and two of the Trustees are visiting the site of a boule court in Nottinghamshire, to find out more about costs and about the increasing popularity of this originally French pastime.

We have an excellent new seat to put in place under the beech tree at the junction of Forties Lane and Chapel Street. We find that certain authorisations are needed before that can be done, and we are currently seeking those approvals. So look out for the improved seating in a week or two!

The Charity has agreed to help fund two events for Smisby people this year. Details of the summer event, on the weekend of 14th and 15th June will be found elsewhere. The date of the second event is Saturday 29th November, when there will be a party in the village hall, after the Christmas lights have been switched on. Details will appear later in the year, but do put the date in your diaries now.
